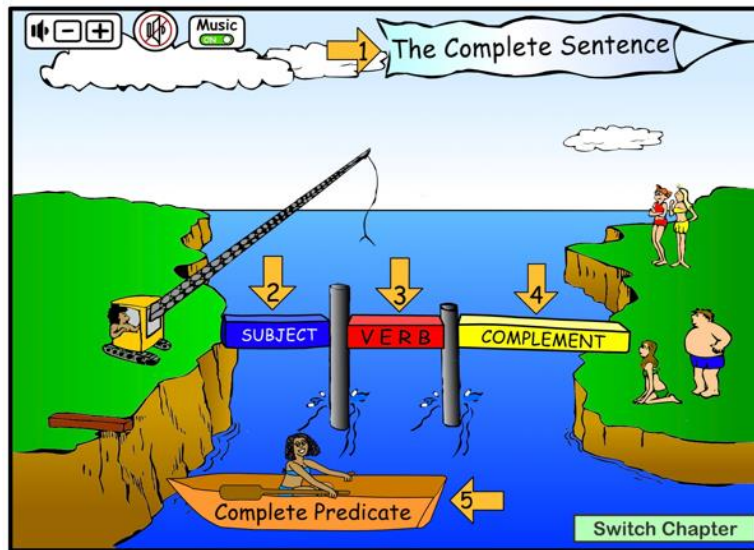


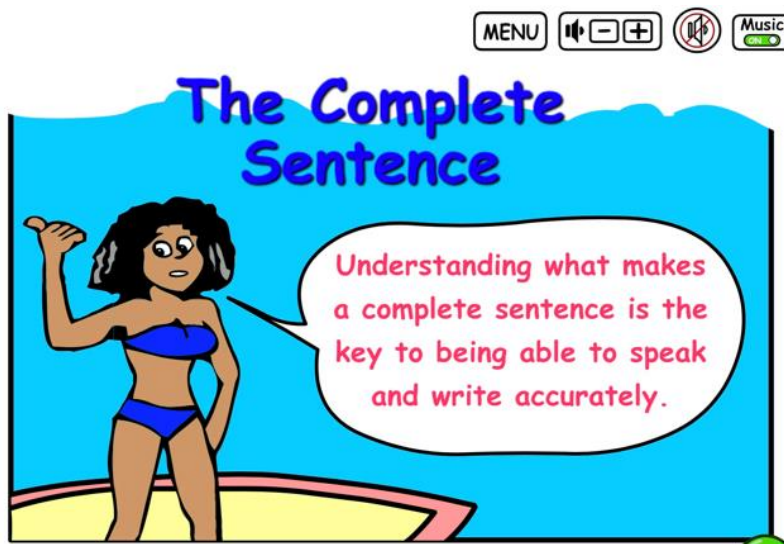

## The COMPLETE SENTENCE



The Complete Sentence must contain a SUBJECT and VERB, begin with a capital letter, and end with terminal punctuation.

**A COMPLETE SENTENCE**

contains a **SUBJECT** and a **VERB**,

begins with a **capital letter**,

and ends with **terminal punctuation**.

Three forms of terminal punctuation are: period, question mark, exclamation mark.

The three forms of **TERMINAL PUNCTUATION** are

- = period
- ? = question mark
- ! = exclamation mark

Doog surfs.

Doog=subject and surf =verb



Doog windsurfs.
